It was suggested that there always be a “Feature Car.” Another possibility is to include articles from members out of town that tell of their history with Studebakers. Maynard brought up the dates for the 2010 International Meet in Arizona, which will be held over Memorial Day weekend, and the Annual Car Show in Hugo on Memorial Day. If Chapter Members are going to Arizona, there will be a need for additional volunteers. This will be addressed further as the date gets closer.

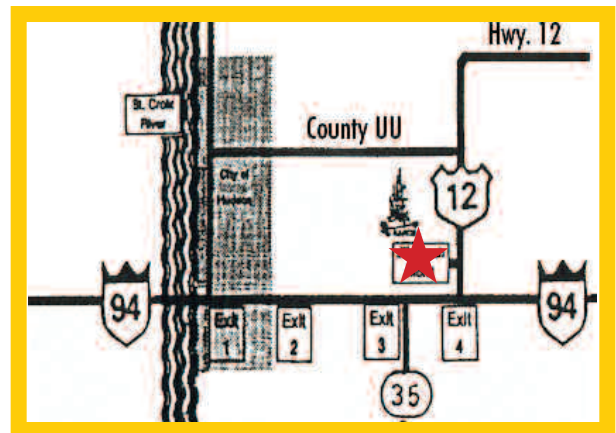
