ONCE AROUND THE BLOCK

Hello, Everybody,

It's nearly time for the "Get the Cars Out" event in Annandale, and as of this writing, I've yet to prepare the Studebaker for the trip west. I hope I'm in the minority and most of the NSC membership has already had their classics running, and polishing rags busy, in spite of Mother Nature's attempt to conceal our rides indefinitely.



Under ideal weather conditions in early September 2010, I accompanied my brother, Clyde, to a Houghton Estate Auction at the Moris Blomgren Farm, eight miles west of Siren, Wisconsin. He told me that the auction contained some pieces of Studebaker memorabilia, such as wrenches, a wheelbarrow, and a 1921 four-door touring sedan. I could hardly wait to get a look at these treasures. Around 7 a.m., we pulled into the auction parking area of the Blomgren farm, which was reminiscent of the parking area at Trollhaugen in Dresser, Wisconsin. To the south, farm buildings and an enormous open-field auction area awaited our inspection. I hope the attached photos can relate the enormity of the auction area, easily more than twice the size of the Blacksmith Lounge car show field.



I immediately knew that the area I wanted to check out was to the east of where Clyde was going to be checking out wrenches, hog oilers and old tractor seats. This was the area loaded with old automobiles from the early twentieth century, tractors (mostly steam-powered), and various old trucks, plows, and antique snowmobiles, including a rear engine Polaris Sno-Traveler, which sold the next day for \$2500 (if only Ed Skomoroh had been there to see this gem).

While Clyde was busy checking out the many car trailers and wagons loaded with wrenches and tools

that Mr. Blomgren, who died at 94 in the 1990s, had undoubtedly put to good use on the farm, I made it a point to hang around and listen to any group of old-timers spinning their yarns of the way it was around there in the old days, and recalling the times when each of these treasures arrived at Mr. Blomgren's farm. It seemed that when one of these relics, none of which were newer than 1950, "died", he simply would buy another and roll the derelict into one of his out buildings. Hence, the huge collection materialized. When I eventually broke away from my eavesdropping, I strolled down to where the 1921 Studebaker Touring Sedan was resting peacefully among its equally ancient automotive cousins. It was in remarkably good condition considering its many years at the farm. Most of the interior fabric was intact, and I tried to imagine how comfortable it must have been to ride in just after World War I, when competition in the auto industry was vigorous worldwide, especially in the United States.



Adjacent to the 1921 Touring were examples of this competition, all of which sold the next day. Included was a 1904 Schacht Auto Buggy, which was in running condition and sold for \$36,500 at the auction the next morning. Others were a 1910 Buick Touring, a 1928 Dodge Brothers four-door, a 1929 Durant four-door, a 1924 Overland two-door and a 1928 Elcar Model D4.

A Nichols and Shepard 25-50 two-cylinder steam tractor was hammered down at \$120,000. (Needless to say, Clyde and I came home tractorless...) Incidentally, the very nice 1921 Studebaker sold for \$3,900.

As the day wound down, my brother enlisted my assistance in transporting his "winnings" including a hog-oiler and some Studebaker wrenches back to the van. As we pulled out of the parking area and headed toward home, we reminisced about all the things we had seen and tried to imagine what it must have been like for Mr. Blomgren to farm there in the early twentieth century. As the miles drifted by, we made tentative plans to attend our next farm auction, and that story will be told another day.

SAINT PAUL STUDEBAKER DEALERS

Here is a list of the Studebaker dealerships in St. Paul. Thanks to member Tom Stochl for putting this bit of history together.

Young Motors, Grand & Victoria

Distributed Studebakers and Pierce Arrows from 1926 to 1934. In 1935 it became Grand Avenue Ford, selling Fords and Lincolns until 1966. It is currently the popular restaurant, *Cafe Latte*. The Studebaker logo is still above the front doors of the building.

Schnider Motors, Third & Pleasant

Sold Studebakers from 1939 to 1959. Added Volkswagons in 1953.

Central Motors Studebaker, University & Marion

A Studebaker dealer from 1947 to 1959, when the dealership became Ron Saxon Ford until 2002.

Ahlgren Brothers,

Smith & Annapolis, West St. Paul
 Sold new Studebakers from 1928 until 1939 but the showroom was too small. In business until 1967.

Killean Motors,

Concord Street, South St. Paul
 Started selling Studebakers in 1947 and continued until 1963 when it became the first home of Fury Motors (Chrysler, Dodge and Plymouth).

McLean Schnider, West Fifth Street

Distributed Studebakers in 1936.

Al Mergens Motors,

West Seventh Street & Grand Avenue
 Were located at 440 West Seventh Street from 1935 to 1946, then they moved to 1330 Grand Avenue until the dealership closed in 1965.

Joy Brothers, Smith Avenue & Third

Sold Studebakers, Packards and Chryslers.

Rauschnot Motors, Rice Street

Sold Studebakers from 1959 until 1966. Stayed in business until 1979.
