SDC Event Insurance. . . .

Carlisle, Penn.—At least six vehicles were damaged Saturday morning at the Fall Carlisle Collector Car Swap Meet when a truck

and trailer lost control and slid down an incline. Despite large crowds at the show, witnesses say that no one was injured in the incident.



The accident happened at around 9:30 a.m. Saturday in the Car Corral area. According to witnesses, a truck pulling a trailer was driving down a relatively steep incline when the truck apparently lost traction and began to slide down the path.

As it slid down the hill, the truck struck several vehicles, and pushed several other cars into each other, including a 1963, Buick Le Sabre, a 1938 Chevy street rod, a 1996 Cadillac Eldorado convertible, and a Mazda RX7 that were all parked in the Car Corral. A late-model Chevy truck with a bed mounted camper and a Dodge van parked in an adjacent swap meet space were also damaged.

Organizers for the 34th Annual event quickly secured the area and began working with the owners of the cars and the driver of the truck and trailer to ensure that the situation was properly handled.

Car enthusiasts from around the world attend the event every year to buy, sell and trade parts, accessories, vehicles and "automobilia."

This is a good example of why all SDC chapter members need to belong to the SDC. We need our own insurance of course, but when something big happens (like in Carlisle, above) there is not only safety in numbers, but COVERAGE in numbers. Accidents can happen at any time and in any place! Imagine this happening at one of our meets! Pass the word on to all the disbelievers out there!

A PENNSYLVANIA HOMECOMING, THE 44TH ANNUAL SDC INTERNATIONAL MEET

During the meeting of the Board of Directors, Studebaker Drivers Club at the 42nd annual Studebaker International meet in Omaha NE, the Keystone Region Chapter of the SDC presented a proposal to host the 44th International Meet in Lancaster, PA. By a majority vote, the Board accepted and approved this proposal, awarding the meet to the Keystone Chapter. This meet is the second time the Keystone Region has hosted an International Meet. The first hosted meet was the 16th

annual International Meet held in Gettysburg in July of 1980. That meet was the largest held up to that time with 683 Studebaker vehicles on the Concourse field and over 900 present. This meet is expected to draw at least that many Studebakers and Avantis and in all probability a few more. A highlight of the 16th annual meet was the dedication of the Studebaker monument placed on the site of the original Studebaker Homestead and Blacksmith Shop just outside of East Berlin, Adams County, PA. During the 44th annual meet this monument will be rededicated.

One may ask, "Why call this meet a Pennsylvania Homecoming?" In simple terms, it can be stated that the first one hundred years of the family's life in the new world was spent in Pennsylvania. Early Staudenbecker family history indicates that life in 18th century Germany was full of many perils and hardships. The family decided that based on things they had heard about the new world, that it was the place for them. This decision once made was not simple to execute, as the family was a member of the cutlers guild. They were skilled blade-makers in the city of Solingen, Germany. The guild was fearful of the move and required the family to move from the city and completely change their trade prior to granting permission for them to leave. In order to accomplish their goal, the Staudenbecker families, three brothers, two of which were married, moved to Hagen, Germany and for the required five years practiced and learned the trade of blacksmithing and farming. In 1736 they finally were free to move to the new world and started their journey down the Rhine River. Once the families reached the sea, they booked

passage on the HMS Harle, a British ship and set sail for the port of Philadelphia. Arriving in Philadelphia, the immigration clerks, unfamiliar with German pronunciations, recorded their names as Studebaker, Studibaker, Studabaker and a few other variations. Eventually the family settled on Studebaker as a surname as it sounded more American. The families moved west from Philadelphia and began to farm in what was then frontier lands. In 1756 Indians raided one of the family farms and one brother, Heinrich, was killed with his wife and children kidnapped. Several years later the children escaped from the Indians and returned to the family homestead. Alas their mother was eventually killed by the raiders, as was her unborn child. By the end of the 18th century, descendants of the original Studebaker family members who came to the new world had entered the blacksmith and wagon making business just east of Gettysburg in what was then York County. One of these was John Studebaker who courted and married Rebecca Mohler, a member of the Ephrata Cloister, in 1820. They began to raise a very large family, which included five boys. John was very proficient in his trade and he and his other family members designed and built what we know today as the famous Conestoga wagon. John realized that his blacksmith and wagon-making shop was too far off of the main east west route through Pennsylvania, today known as US Route 30. That realization and stories told by those who frequented his blacksmith shop led to his decision to move his family further west first to Ashland, Ohio and then even further west to South Bend Indiana in order to provide a better life for them. As you can see from this very brief Studebaker family history their first 100 years in the new world were spent in Pennsylvania thus this meet is a Homecoming for the Studebaker auto enthusiast and their families. Come and join us in this celebration starting September 14 and concluding on September 20, 2008 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. See you in the future as I write about our past.

Drive For Kids. . . .

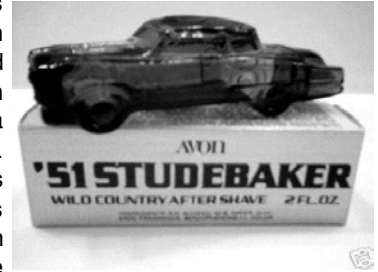

Studebaker Toys by Ernie Loga. .

Our featured toy this month is actually not a toy but an aftershave/cologne bottle sold and distributed by Avon Products, Inc. Avon has made a vast assortment of bottles. Everything from women's figurines to animals. Starting as the smallest of enterprises in 1886, Avon has grown to become the world's leading cosmetics and toiletries company.



The story of Avon begins with the story of a man and his dream. David H. McConnell, was born in 1858 to a hard-working farm family in upstate New York, and worked as a door to door book salesman to help pay his way through college. Industrious, energetic and endowed with a warm feeling for people, he advanced rapidly and, within a few years, was able to buy out the business. By 1880, he had developed a successful business and often gave his women customers a gift of inexpensive perfume with their purchases. A true entrepreneur, Mr. McConnell, realized that his perfumes were more popular than his books, and recognized the opportunity to create a brand new business, one that sold toiletries directly to customers.

In 1886, at the age of 28, Mr. McConnell began such a business. Inspired by his former employer's glowing reports of life in a western state, Mr. McConnell called his new business the California Perfume Company. By 1928, the name California Perfume Company seemed too regional for a company doing business in 48 states. On a visit to England, David McConnell was struck by the similarity of the land around Stratford-on-Avon, the home of William Shakespeare - to the countryside surrounding his own Suffern laboratory. A new line of products called "Avon" was introduced in 1929, identified with a representation of Anne Hathaway's cottage, and in 1939 the company's name was officially changed to Avon Products, Inc.

The 1951 Studebaker Starlight Coupe was part of several small scale produced between 1960 and 1980. The 1951 starlight was introduced in 1975 and 1976. It is about 5" long, and is made of smoked blue glass with a plastic tail piece. It comes in a box with a short history of the car and a nice side view picture of a Starlight Coupe.. The current value of this item is about \$10.00 to \$15.00 in new condition with box. Used and empty decanters can be found at yard sales and flea markets between \$1.00 to \$3.00 without a box and \$3.00 to \$5.00 with a box.
