Tech Tip. . . .

AN AMAZING TECH TIP FOR INSTALLING OIL PAN GASKETS. In the late 1950s, shortly after I invented the Studebaker 259 cid V8 engine, I received a gripe from a Studebaker mechanic in Westminster, MD, who serviced all sizes of Studebaker V8 engines. His name escapes me but he was a neat guy, a handsome devil, with a great looking wife and a nutty kid. His name was Jim something.

Jim Something bemoaned the difficulty in easily aligning oil pan gaskets when servicing the Studebaker V8 engines. He found that the new gaskets would slip around and were difficult to hold in place and the screw holes wouldn't line up. The installation was time consuming and required some type of glue. Glue on gaskets is a sinful procedure which should always be avoided. Many mechanics have been permanently disabled or killed by using glue on gaskets.

At that point in time, I had not yet invented the wonderful, all-purpose silicone sealers that everyone uses today to temporarily hold things in place. But because of my superior, unmatched ability to solve vexing mechanical problems, I gave Jim Something's problem almost four minutes of concentrated thought. The solution came to me in three minutes and forty-nine seconds. Jim Something needed to acquire a couple of two or three foot length of 5/16" course threaded rod and cut the rod into at least 20 segments, each about two inches long. At that point, he could insert a pre-cut stud into each of the 20 threaded holes in the bottom of the block. Each of these short pre-cut studs should be inserted into each hole and secured with two or three complete turns.

Then, he could install each pan gasket, which would be held in place perfectly by using the protruding studs as guides. Once the gasket was installed, he could mount the oil pan and remove each stud, one at a time, and replace it with the proper oil pan screw. The problem was solved. This same technique could be used on the water pump manifold and the timing gear cover with success.

At last report, Jim Something had retired to somewhere in Southern Pennsylvania and has made a profitable career of cutting threaded rods into two inch long segments and selling these studs to clueless Studebaker show car people as NOS Studebaker memorabilia.

Deja Vu. . . .

This is in reply to a Northstar newsletter containing an article by Jim Rock describing an incident in which he was advised by a Studebaker dealer not to buy one because Studebaker was going out of business and parts would be difficult to come by. The same newsletter issue also had an article about Tippecanoe, the former home of Clement Studebaker, now an upscale restaurant.

As I recall, in addition to Randolph Light Studebaker dealership there were at least two other Studebaker dealerships in Minneapolis; Steenerson Studebaker on Lyndale Avenue North between Plymouth Avenue and West Broadway, and Jim Angeles Studebaker in the Hennepin-Harmon area near downtown. It was late fall 1962, and my brother John was in the market for a new car. He wanted a convertible and had the cash to buy one. He liked the Lark Daytona a lot, and since we lived on the northside, one day he visited Steenersons, fully intending to buy a Daytona convertible. I went along for moral support. When we got there, I remember there were two cars on the showroom floor, a black GT Hawk, and a green Lark hardtop. John told the salesman that he was very interested in buying a Daytona convertible, and when could he take delivery etc. The salesman, however, went over to the Lark hardtop and said that IT was the car for John, and insisted that he should buy THAT car and not a convertible. John stood his ground and replied that he was not interested in anything but a convertible. The salesman then said "Well if you think I'm going to order a convertible this time of year, you are out of your mind!"

We left dumbfounded, but a few days later John found a friendly Ford dealer who has happy to sell him a Sunliner convertible. The Steenerson property was bought by the City in the late sixties or early seventies, and razed for urban renewal.

Then there was a remarkable coincidence which occurred. I had just finished reading the piece in this same newsletter issue about Tippecanoe, the Clement Studebaker mansion, when Dulcie came home from one of her antique excursions with a framed print of a pencil sketch of, you guessed it, TIPPECANOE! The name of the artist is Janice Skivington, and its title is Tipsecanoe Restaurant, former home of Clement Studebaker.

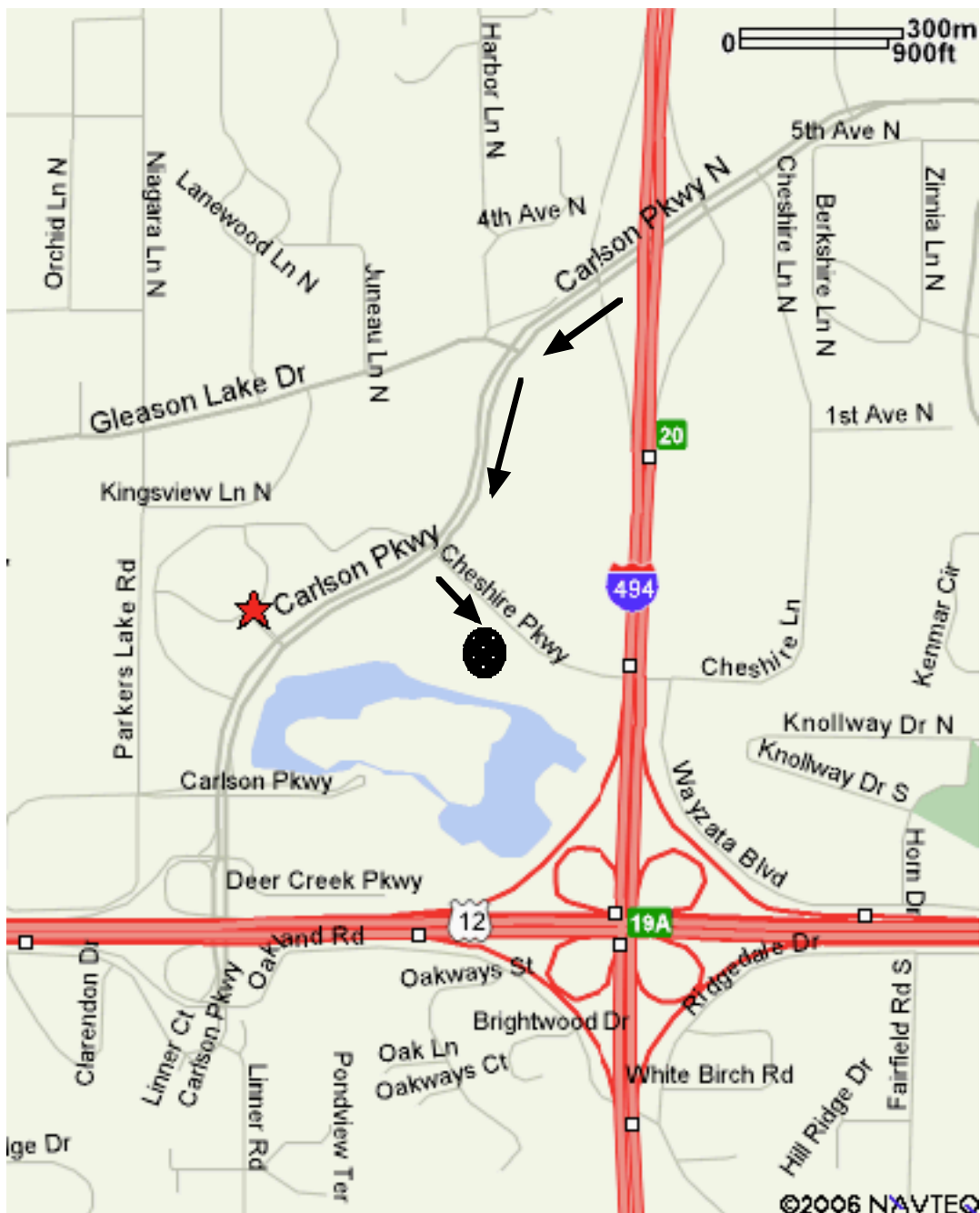

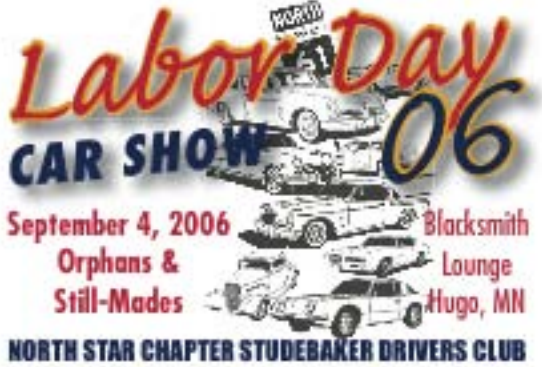
